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<u>Developing together: Best Practice in stakeholder engagement and marine & landfall permitting.</u>



- Our pitch, based on learning from the BESTGRID Project, proposes that developing marine infrastructure projects through to their landfall, together, and in cooperation, with stakeholders from the beginning can be beneficial to all; TSOs, Developers, Stakeholders and Permitting Authorities.
- Today through real life examples of good and bad practice we will look at how to improve engagement and move best practice forward.
- There are many experiences of good and bad engagement but these are rarely captured or learned from. This needs to change if we are to improve public acceptance and permitting processes which in turn will improve project delivery.

- There is much discussion about early stakeholder engagement and speeding up the permitting process.
- We have learned that whilst the former is often a given, the latter is not always such an obvious goal.
