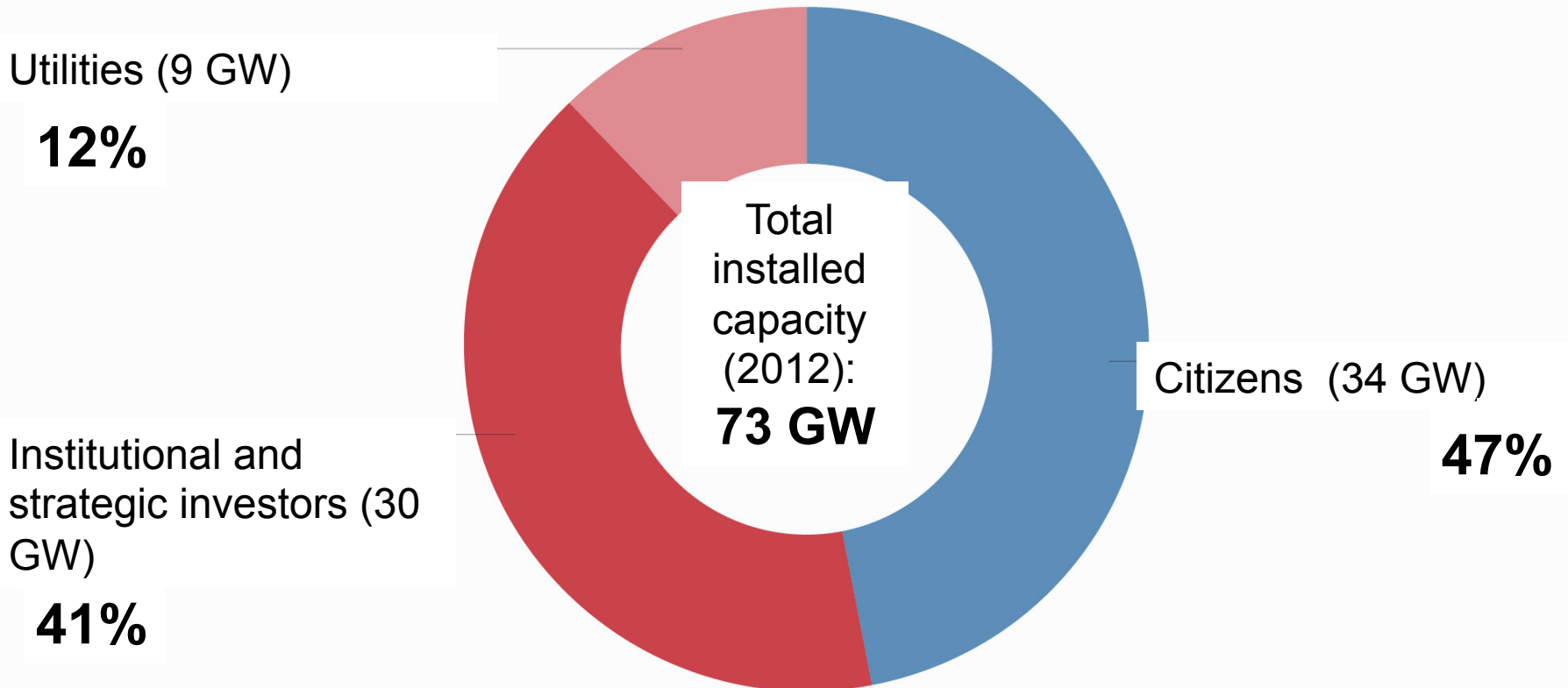

Renewable Electricity in the Hand of Citizens (Germany)



the electricity sector is in the middle of a strong transition towards more diverse and decentralised ownership. Is this citizen co-ownership necessarily more democratic and will it lead to a broader public acceptability?

Pro and Contra

- Pro:
 - power not any longer centralised in the hand of a view utilities;
 - commitment of many citizens (directly or via co-operation) /ready to take responsibility
 - not any longer wars about energy - war is the biggest enemy of democracy
 - empowerment of citizens and decentralised value creation;
- Contra:
 - Can everybody afford to participate ?
 - Is this part of a bigger trend of systemic undermining of solidarity?: The rich (industry, individuals) pay for their own infrastructure - the (relatively) poor have to pay or are excluded from fundamental services.

Decentralised energy will play a much stronger role in the future - pro democracy means: decentralisation **and** responsibility for system
